145. Science or craft?

Clinical research is a scientific enterprise, but we conduct it more like a craft. Most study coordinators and clinical research associates learn bits and pieces of tradecraft from more experienced people, rather than from systematic training. Regulatory myths, inefficient processes, and other folklore pass from generation to generation. Numerous publications, training programs, and other educational resources are available, but underutilized. It's no surprise, since professional certification is optional. Few site questionnaires even ask about certification. Less than one percent of investigators are certified. Unlike respiratory therapists, dental hygienists, and home health aides, clinical researchers do not even have an organization to accredit educational programs. What am I missing here?
